

TUESDAY, JUNE 27, 2017
BOARD OF ALDERMEN MINUTES
6:00PM

Mayor Rhorer called the special meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. on June 27, 2017 at 109 East Broadway, Ashland, Missouri.

Mayor Rhorer called the roll:

Ward one: George Campbell-here, Danny Clay-absent
Ward two: Jesse Bronson-here, James Fasciotti-here
Ward three: Rick Lewis-here, Jeffery Sapp-here

Staff Present: Deputy City Clerk Shelley Martin, Street Supervisor Coby Morris and Lyn Woolford, Police Chief/City Administrator.

Mayor Rhorer presented a Resolution authorizing the Mayor, on behalf of the City to enter into an agreement with Scotwood Industries, INC. for dust control on City gravel roads. Alderman Bronson made motion and seconded by Alderman Sapp to enter into an agreement with Scotwood Industries, INC. City Administrator Woolford said we would be using the Boone County bid price. Street Supervisor Coby Morris stated this was for dust control of the roads. He further stated Scotwood Industries had the equipment to fluff and roll the roads while working on them and this would cut down on grading. He expected Scotwood Industries to be in the area by the end of this week or next, to work on Robbie Forbis and Hunters Bend. Mayor Rhorer called for the vote. Alderman Campbell-aye, Alderman Fasciotti-aye, Alderman Bronson-aye, Alderman Lewis-aye, Alderman Sapp-aye, Alderman Clay-absent. Motion carried.

City Administrator Woolford advised that approximately 875,000 gallons of sludge was removed from the lagoon. This left approximately 3 feet. He reported that Stephen Lin said it would be okay but it would be better if we could continue to take it down. Metro Ag agreed to finish out the remainder of Friday (6-23-17) to remove additional gallons, which would be approximately 25 more truck loads. City Administrator Woolford advised the contract allowed the City to revise the amount of sludge removed and it was within the budget to do so. Mayor Rhorer said Metro Ag did a good job, were efficient and there was no smell. Alderman Campbell asked about the cell curtains. Street Supervisor Morris advised they were not in good condition. City Administrator Woolford advised the curtains were tattered but sufficient per Stephen Lin. Alderman Campbell asked if they will need to be replaced. Coby Morris stated not at this time. When the plant is completed they will be obsolete.

Alderman Bronson made motion and seconded by Alderman Sapp to adjourn the meeting. Mayor Rhorer called for the vote. Alderman Campbell-aye, Alderman Bronson-aye, Alderman Fasciotti-aye, Alderman Lewis-aye, Alderman Sapp-aye, Alderman Clay-absent. Motion carried.
